Tom Hoey Joins the Board

In October, the Sanderson Museum's Steering Committee nominated Tom Hoey to the Board of Directors, who was then unanimously elected. We would like to introduce you to Tom:

Tom holds a Bachelor's degree in music education from the School of Music at West Chester University and taught for 33 years, principally as Band Director in the Garnet Valley district.


In the 1980's he ran Hoey Brothers Music Management bringing musicians to Delaware County such as singer Frank Sinatra, Jr. and trumpeter Maynard Ferguson. He also served two terms on the board of directors of the 250-member Association of Church Musicians of Philadelphia.

In addition, he has managed and marketed several successful music groups including the Montels and Main Street, former house band of the Mendenhall Inn ballroom. Currently he manages the Lenape Brass, which went from new ensemble to being invited to perform at Winterthur in less than 2 years.

Tom has been a behind the scenes volunteer at the

Sanderson Museum for 9 years. In 2014 he researched the music and organization of the Pocopson Valley Boys and formed a 10-piece tribute band with two of the original members, that performed on the Sanderson side porch to an enthusiastic

audience. Later in 2022, he spun his research into a story for The Historian.

In 2015 he discovered the old side porch brackets in the Sanderson basement and funded the project to have them restored. Then in 2018, he assisted in the re-configuring of the Music Room for the now permanent Sanderson Strings exhibit.

As an avid historian, Hoey did a first- person portrayal of "March King" John Philip Sousa for over 30 years. In addition, he founded and directed the 90-member Upper Darby Sousa Band, which performed for thousands of fans annually at the Rose Tree Park, the Ballroom at Congress Hall in Cape May, NJ, and Longwood Gardens, where Sousa actually performed.

Tom has also been part of other special events at the Sanderson Museum. In discussions with others who know him, it was said that "... he has been in business since age 16 and put himself through college 100% with his music."

Tom's contributions to the Sanderson cannot be ignored, nor can the similarities between his and Chris's expansive musical talents and love of history. It is clear that Tom's election hits the right note. Welcome, Tom!

On July 29, 2023, the Sanderson Museum participated in the Lafayette Day event at Thornbury Farm. Despite the hot and humid day, Sanderson Curator Chuck Ulmann was in fine spirits welcoming visitors to the Sanderson display.

There were two most welcome Sanderson Museum members that afternoon. Arthur (Casey) Cleveland III had flown up from Florida. Casey was born in the Gilpin House on the Battlefield and counted Chris Sanderson and Andy Wyeth as his neighbors. Joining Casey that afternoon was member Missie Bauman of Wilmington, Delaware, sister of the late, beloved Sanderson board member John Aaron.

Thornbury Farm CSA, is the property of Randell Spackman, son of the late Thomas Spackman.
